

Vineyard Region Entre-Deux-Mers

Château Mongiron is situated between the Dordogne and Garonne rivers, benefiting from a unique terroir defined by high-quality limestone soil. This exceptional soil not only produces premium wines but also imparts rich mineral flavors, adding depth and complexity to each bottle. The combination of its ideal location and distinctive terroir makes Château Mongiron a standout in crafting wines of exceptional character and quality.





Château Mongiron is situated in the Entre-Deux-Mers region of Bordeaux, France, nestled between the Garonne and Dordogne rivers. This wedge-shaped vineyard is not only one of the oldest wine-producing areas in France, with a winemaking history dating back over 2,000 years, but also boasts the largest vineyard area in Bordeaux.

The estate is adjacent to the small town of Nerigean in the Entre-Deux-Mers region. In the 12th century, the Grand-Sauve Abbey was established, and since then, the town of Nerigean has enjoyed the long-standing protection of religious heritage. Today, standing in the vineyards of Mongiron, one can still see the distant church and hear the blessing of its bells.





Mongiron, symbolizes a mother's embrace and a sanctuary of safety. This land, graced with such a tender name, has continuously nurtured and protected the life it holds. From its origins as an ancient ocean to its current era of limestone-rich vineyards, it has been a cradle of perpetual vitality.

Perched on a small elevated plateau between rivers, the vineyard's soil is underlain by a massive limestone bedrock, formed over millennia from the sedimentation and accumulation of marine life. As time has transformed the once-submerged ocean into solid ground, the traces of past life remain embedded deep within the earth, silently witnessing the ongoing cycle of life.

Winemaking Techniques

Stainless Steel Fermentation

The most widely used fermentation vessels in modern winemaking.

Mongiron utilizes stainless steel tanks of varying sizes to separately ferment grapes from different vineyard plots. The entire fermentation process is temperature-controlled, ensuring precise management of the fermentation progress.

Egg-Shaped Concrete Tank Fermentation

Concrete's excellent insulation properties have won the favor of many winemakers. The unique dynamic circulation system of egg-shaped concrete tanks contributes to a rounder and more balanced wine texture. Château Mongiron uses partial concrete tank fermentation for its white wines, resulting in richer and more complex flavors.

Oak Barrel Aging

Five Major French Oak Barrel Brands for Aging

Sylvain	One of the premium oak barrel brands, known for its high-quality wood and delicate, elegant toasting; it enhances the aromatic expression and depth of the wine
Seguin Moreau	Imparts a softer, more feminine elegance to the wine, perfectly complementing the dark fruit aromas in red wines
Éclat de Vinéa	A foundational oak barrel brand, primarily used to enhance red fruit aromas and add subtle vanilla notes to the wine
Rémond	A classic Burgundy oak barrel brand, known for delivering precise and refined aromatic profiles by the end of the aging process
Ermitage	Primarily used for aging Cabernet family varieties (Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon) and Petit Verdot, highlighting the red fruit characteristics of these grape

Each barrel is carefully selected to ensure the wines reflect the unique terroir and craftsmanship of Château Mongiron.

In the year 1344, Pey de Lascortz, a trusted squire of King Edward III, arrived in Saint-Sulpice de Faleyrens, a region steeped in history and natural beauty. He established a castle and named it after himself, giving rise to the name Lescours for his estate.

The name Hermitage, meaning "Hill of the Hermit", reflects the serene and secluded nature of the land, evoking a sense of timeless tranquility and connection to the earth.



Saint-Émilion

Nestled in the heart of Bordeaux, the Saint-Émilion wine region is a place where narrow, cobblestone streets are adorned with charming Romanesque churches. Its winemaking heritage dates back to the 2nd century, when the Romans first planted vineyards in this fertile land. By the 4th century, the renowned Latin poet Ausonius had already praised the region's rich and full-bodied wines.

The development of Saint-Émilion's wine culture is deeply intertwined with the story of a monk named Emilion, after whom the town is named. In the 8th century, Emilion settled in the area, seeking solitude in a hermitage. He later established a monastery, where he and fellow monks began producing and trading wine, laying the foundation for Saint-Émilion's enduring winemaking legacy.

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The Wisdom of Terroir

Château L'Hermitage Lescours is situated on a small plateau just **100 meters from the Dordogne River**. The river's moderating influence on the climate, combined with the slightly elevated altitude, creates a unique microclimate that is ideal for viticulture.

By understanding the estate's microclimate and soil structure, we are able to precisely manage the balanced growth of the vines and the quality of the grapes.

Soil Composition Analysis

Topsoil


Composed mainly of black sandy soil and clay. The black sandy soil ensures excellent drainage, while the clay retains just the right amount of moisture. This balance provides the vines with optimal water stress, which is crucial for grape ripening and the development of complex aromas.

Subsoil

Predominantly gravelly soil. The absence of large rock structures allows the roots to penetrate deeply. This type of soil warms up quickly in spring, promoting early vine growth. Additionally, its excellent permeability prevents waterlogging at deeper levels, ensuring healthy root development.

Vineyard Management

Driven by a pursuit of excellence and a deep respect for nature, our team meticulously tends to the 4 hectares of vineyards and the cellar, day after day, year after year.

The vineyards are divided into micro-plots based on grape varieties and growth patterns. This meticulous approach extends naturally into the winemaking process. Each micro-plot is hand-harvested at optimal ripeness and fermented separately, ensuring the unique character of every parcel is preserved.

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Cellar Management

Precision Fermentation

During the two-week alcoholic fermentation, temperatures are meticulously controlled between **18°C and 24°C**. This ensures the yeast remains active and stable while effectively inhibiting the growth of harmful microorganisms.

Artful Aging

The aging process takes place in oak barrels sourced from **nine carefully selected French cooperages**, primarily using medium and medium-plus toast levels. Each barrel, crafted with different techniques and styles, is thoughtfully paired with specific grape varieties to enhance and refine their unique characteristics.

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Château L'Hermitage Lescours Team

The estate has further strengthened its production team by inviting **Jean-Philippe Fort**, a senior member of the Michel Rolland team, to serve as its winemaking consultant. In early 2019, **Xavier Lacoste**, former vineyard manager of Château Valandraud, joined the team as winemaker and vineyard manager, bringing his expertise to elevate the estate's wines.
